From the CLP/Youth Pastor

With Thanksgiving and Christmas, it gets to be a very busy time of year and before we get caught up in the holiday festivities let us pause and remember what the season is all about. The Heidelberg Catechism was written in 1563 and it is a very precious catechism that we hold onto being Presbyterian. It is divided in three lines. Questions 1–11 articulate the misery of mankind due to their sin and rebellion against God. Then in questions 12–58 it outlines man's deliverance which is through the person and work of Christ. Lastly, questions 86–129 are all about thanksgiving. In the catechism we have guilt, grace, and gratitude. If you haven't already, I encourage you to read through the catechism and to meditate upon it this holiday season.

Question 86 asks, "Since then we are delivered from our misery, merely of grace, through Christ, without any merits of our own, why must we still do good works? The answer: Because Christ, having redeemed and delivered us by His blood, also renews us by His Holy Spirit after His own image; that we may testify by the whole of our conduct, our gratitude to God for His blessings, that He may be praised by us" (italics emphasis mine).

Gratitude is initiated by an act of kindness, and the act of kindness that initiates our gratitude is God's gracious blessing in the person and work of Christ. If Christ did not come to earth and if he did not die in our place, we would be without hope awaiting the very judgment of God on our last day. But since God initiated our salvation and first loved us and pursued us and bought us by His blood, we have so much to be thankful for. Our union with Christ, by faith, should cause us to be grateful every single one of our days.

In Psalm 103:1–4 the Psalmist says, "Bless the LORD, O my Soul, and all that is within me, bless His holy name! Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits, who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy." There are four blessings which we get from the Lord in this Psalm which should cause within us a heart of gratitude. The Psalmist does say that the Lord heals all of your diseases; this is not a prosperity message or a prosperity gospel, rather this is God redeeming us from the effects of sin. We might not get healed in this lifetime, but when we pass on into glory there will be no diseases and therefore, we will be healed from all of our diseases and we know we are completely saved from the disease of sin because of Christ.

Pastor Ken Jones said, "Christian gratitude is grounded in the knowledge of God's grace toward us in Christ, and that knowledge manifests in high esteem and awe of that grace, which propels us to serve and please Him."

So, this holiday season, be thankful of the grace we have in Christ and look upward to our spiritual realities that we have in Christ and be comforted that Christ is with you day by day, moment by moment if you are in Christ. Take comfort this year as we look to the manger knowing that Christ has come for those whom He loves and there is a day coming when He is going to make all things new. Until then let us press on with thankful hearts for what Christ has done and is doing in our lives. To God alone be the Glory!




